Book Week

Next Week (Week 6) is Book Week. Lots of exciting activities have been planned for our school. Book making, a visit from author Jane Jolly, buddy reading across the school, a yummy themed canteen lunch (Wednesday 25/8), Write a Book in a Day and an assortment of classroom activities with shortlisted books are just some of the highlights. Not to mention, the infamous Book Week dress up day... This will be on the Wednesday (25/8). Students can come dressed as their favourite character from a book, or they can explore this year's theme of Old Worlds, New Worlds, Other Worlds.



Phonics Screening

This week, along with all other Year 1 students around the state, our Year 1 students undertook the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. This is a Phonics Check to better understand the phonics knowledge of our students. The Check looks at how well your child can 'decode' written words.

The Phonics Check helps teachers and the school to confirm whether your child is making their expected progress in reading. Teachers and schools can then use this information to inform their teaching program. A preliminary look at the results of our students, has indicated that the targeted teaching and early intervention we are providing at Morphett Vale Primary is working!

The Phonics Check includes a mix of real words and 'non-words' (sometimes called 'pseudo words', 'made-up words' or 'nonsense words').

Non-words are important to include because words such as 'vap' or 'jound' are new to all children. Children cannot read the pseudo words by using their memory or vocabulary; they have to use their decoding skills. This is a fair way to assess their ability to decode.

You are welcome to make a time to speak with your child's teacher so that they can tell you about your child's progress in phonics and how they have done in the Check. If your child has found the Check difficult, the teacher will also be able to tell you what support has been put in place to help them improve. The Check ensures that teachers understand which children need extra help with phonic decoding. Remember that all children are individuals and develop at different rates.
