Dental for Schools Visits

Dental for schools will be returning in the first week of Term 3.

Consent forms will be going home in the next few weeks, so please return them to ensure your child can access this service. Dental for Schools provides preventive and restorative services.

These services are designed to prevent dental problems before they start and to treat existing dental issues quickly.

With the assistance of Medicare's Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS) this school dental program is set to directly reduce the rate of dental decay and hospitalisation with early preventive dentistry and regular checkups.

Is it free? - In most cases the visit can be BulkBilled by Medicare's (CDBS) or claimed through private health. This will be checked by the administration team prior to the visit.

Jodie Smith Junior special options



Play-based learning is an appropriate and effective pedagogical approach to support students' learning and development. When students are provided purposeful play-based learning experiences, they can engage intentionally and actively with people, objects, and representations. This allows for development of age appropriate skills, knowledge, understanding and dispositions for learning and making sense of their social and natural worlds (Fellowes and Oakley 2018; Porter 2016).

Purposeful play-based opportunities have been provided through a variety of teaching and learning activities and stimuli in in the classroom for mathematics. In our class we have been building number sense and number fluency by playing a range of games that increase students knowledge and automaticity with numbers. At the end of mathematics lessons students are asked to reflect on 3 aspects of the activity.
